Community-Based Respiratory Virus Guidance

- Updated guidance is for **COMMUNITY-based** setting ONLY.
- It does **NOT apply to healthcare settings**
- Healthcare guidance is UNCHANGED and not expected to change in the near future

Community-based Respiratory Virus Guidance

- Updated guidance applies for facilities which provide **non-skilled personal care** (AL, SLF, SMHRF, etc) in NON-HEALTHCARE areas
- **Healthcare personnel** providing health care to one or more residents in a non-skilled facility should follow **CDC healthcare guidance**.
 - For example: physical therapy, wound care, IV injections, catheter care, hospice care

People 65+ should now receive an additional dose of the updated 2023-2024 COVID-19 vaccine



- Older adults are at increased risk of severe illness, hospitalization, and death if they get COVID
- ACIP recommends a second dose this season for additional protection
- Additional dose should be >4 months from initial updated dose



Extensively Drug-Resistant Organism (XDRO) Registry

Two main purposes:

- **Surveillance:** Facilities, labs, and IDPH report XDROs into registry
- **Information Exchange:** Per new administrative code changes, certain facilities will be required to query or receive auto alerts
 - Acute care and critical access hospitals,
 - Long-term acute care hospitals
 - Skilled nursing and intermediate care facilities
 - Dialysis facilities



77 IL Admin Code 690.1500 - New requirement to query XDRO Registry or get auto alerts

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- b) The Department requires the following health care facilities to query or implement alert notification with the XDRO Registry in order to identify new admissions with XDROs:
- 1) Hospitals;
 - 2) Long-term acute care hospitals; and
 - 3) Skilled nursing and intermediate care facilities
 - 4) Dialysis centers

- Allows IDPH to make CRE, C. auris, CRAB, CP-CRPA, and any other emerging XDRO reportable
- Reporting time frame updated from 7 days to 3 days

Illinois CRE Surveillance Definition

Enterobacterales with one of the following test results:

1. Molecular test (e.g., PCR) specific for carbapenemase

OR

2. Phenotypic test (e.g., modified Carbapenem Inactivation Method, mCIM) specific for carbapenemase production

OR


3. For *E. coli* and *Klebsiella* species only (excluding *K. aerogenes*): non-susceptible to ONE of the carbapenems (doripenem, meropenem, or imipenem) AND resistant to ALL third generation cephalosporins tested (ceftriaxone, cefotaxime, and ceftazidime).

Report 1st CRE event per patient per encounter

If a case of CRE meets this definition, you are required to submit to the XDRO Registry within 3 days of receiving the report.

(Note: With adoption of new CD rules, timeframe has changed from 7 to 3 days.)

Report Carbapenem-Resistant Enterobacteriales (CRE) isolates to the XDRO registry

Illinois C. auris Surveillance Definition

- **Confirmed case:** Person with confirmatory laboratory evidence of *C. auris* using either culture or a validated culture-independent test (e.g., Nucleic Acid Amplification Test [NAAT])

If a case meets this definition, you are required to submit to the XDRO Registry within 3 days of receiving the report.

Illinois CP-CRPA & CRAB Surveillance Definitions

- **CRPA* and CRAB* not currently reportable in IL**
- **CP-CRPA definition:** *Pseudomonas aeruginosa* with positive molecular test specific for carbapenemase or positive phenotypic test for carbapenemase production.
- **CRAB definition:** *Acinetobacter baumannii* resistant to a carbapenem (imipenem, meropenem, or doripenem) or positive molecular test specific for carbapenemase.

*Will eventually add under new 690.540 section. Memo would be sent out to notify facilities/labs.



New users (who do not have access to the IDPH web portal): You must register for access to the IDPH web portal. Fill out the form to create a new username, and select the box to access the application "INEDSS (Disease Surveillance) System/XDRO registry (extensively drug resistant organism)." This may take several weeks to process.

Users who have access to the IDPH web portal, but not the INEDSS/XDRO application: If you already have a username and access to the IDPH web portal, **do not fill out a new registration form.** Please have your facility Portal Registration Authority (PRA)* send an email to DPH.Security@illinois.gov requesting for you to have access to the additional application "INEDSS (Disease Surveillance) System/XDRO registry (extensively drug resistant organism)." Make sure your PRA includes your full name and User ID.

Existing INEDSS users: Your existing IDPH log-in will automatically give you access to the XDRO registry.

* Each facility needs a Portal Registration Authority (PRA). The PRA is a designated employee at the facility who is authorized to approve access to IDPH applications for other staff at the facility. 





Facilities/Labs report to INEDSS & then HAI Program enters cases into XDRO.

Providers can also send confirmatory lab reports via secured fax (312-338-0390) or encrypted email to DPH.XDRORRegistry@illinois.gov in addition to completing an INEDSS case report.

*Provider reporting of C. auris into XDRO is currently in the works and once live, providers can report C. auris directly into XDRO.




Number of Queries Conducted from the XDRO Registry, 2018 – 2023
