Perinatal Hepatitis B Vaccination

In the United States, each year more than 24,000 infants are born to mothers who are chronically infected with Hepatitis B virus (HBV). Hepatitis B can be passed from an infected mother to child during birth. Transmission at birth is associated with a 90% risk for chronic infection. Chronic hepatitis B carries a 25% risk of death from liver failure or liver cancer. However, post-exposure prophylaxis (PEP) of newborns born to infected mothers is 85-95% effective when administered within 12 hours of birth.

Obstetric providers in Illinois are mandated to test all pregnant women for hepatitis B surface antigen (HBsAg; a marker for HBV infection) and report all positive HBsAg test results to the Chicago Department of Public Health (CDPH). To prevent perinatal transmission, the Advisory Committee for Immunization Practices (ACIP) recommends that infants born to hepatitis B infected women be administered Hepatitis B Immunoglobulin (HBIG) and the first dose of Hepatitis B vaccine within 12 hours of birth. Completion of the 3-dose vaccine series is essential. Then post-vaccination serological testing (PVST) of the infants should be preformed at 9-12 months or 1-2 months after the completion of the vaccine series. Timely post-vaccination serological testing is important to determine the infant's immune status and determine if additional doses of the HBV vaccine are necessary.

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Pre-Order your VFC and CHIP Flu Vaccines Now

Believe it or not, flu season is right around the corner! Your clinic can preorder your VFC and CHIP flu vaccines <u>here.</u>

All the vaccines below are available for VFC patients. The vaccines in yellow are the only ones available for CHIP patients.

Please base your order numbers on patient numbers from the 2021-2022 flu season for more accurate estimates. Delivery of new flu vaccine will likely become available in August and September. Any flu vaccine from this past year that will expire on 6/30/22 should be kept in your refrigerator until that point. Once expired, this vaccine can be returned using a Vaccine Return Form (see HAN).

Expiring Flu Vaccines from 2021-2022 Season

VFC Providers – Please do not dispose of extra flu vaccine doses before they expire; instead, see if any infants have become eligible for their flu shot (or another dose) since their last visit.

Because these are quadrivalent vaccines whose antigens change each flu season, infants could benefit from the extra protection provided by the varying antigens that are in the vaccine both last year and this year. A list of eligible patients can be found by using the Immunizations Due report in I-CARE.

What to do with expired vaccine: Attached to the newsletter are two documents, the VFC/CHIP vaccine return form and instructions for when your flu vaccines do actually expire.
