### Reminder- 2018 Back-up Thermometer Digital Data Logger Requirement

Effective January 1, 2018, back-up thermometers for monitoring VFC vaccines will need to be continuous temperature monitoring devices (digital data loggers - DDLs). **All Chicago VFC providers are required to have one back-up DDL for their clinic.** In order to be compliant with the VFC regulations, the back-up must have the following:

- 1. A temperature probe in a buffered material such as glycol
- 2. An active temperature display that can be easily read from the outside of the unit
- 3. The capacity for continuous monitoring and recording capabilities where the data can be routinely downloaded

The following are additional recommended features:

- Alarm for out-of-range temperatures
- o Current, minimum, and maximum temperatures display
- Low battery indicator
- Accuracy of +/- 1°F (0.5°C)
- Memory storage of at least 4,000 readings
- o Reading rate at a maximum time interval of every 15 minutes
- Use of a medium that best reflects the temperature of the vaccine (glycol or glass beads)

Chicago VFC providers may purchase any DDL they prefer to use. Please note, the Chicago VFC Program can only provide technical support for Log Tag DDLs. If your practice would like to order the same DDL as you received from Chicago VFC, place your order through www.vfcdataloggers.com. # How to obtain immunization histories from the Puerto Rico Immunization Registry PRIR - prir.salud.gov.pr

To be used if a patient or family has relocated from Puerto Rico and cannot provide an immunization record.

#### Instructions:

- A. Go to https://prir.salud.gov.pr/PRIRPRD/clientSearch.do?language=en
- B. To access information, parent/guardian/healthcare provider/clinic staff can search PRIR online using 3 unique identifiers:
  - 1) Name
    - i. Note: one OR two last names can be entered ex. can find a child with just one last name if they have two
  - 2) Date of birth
  - 3) Social security number OR Medicaid ID
- C. Print and file immunization record
- D. Provide copy to parent
