## 47° 48° 49° 50° 51° 52° 53° 54° & higher **DANGER ZONE - TOO HOT**

If you ever see temps in this danger zone:

- Alert your supervisor immediately.
- Wait no more than 60 min and check to see if the temperature has returned to the proper range.
- ➤ If temps are still in DANGER ZONE after 60 minutes. download the data and email to chicagovfc@cityofchicago.org
- Document the date and actions you take on the VSTR
