# U.S. Measles Cases at Highest Point Since 1992

### 971 Measles Cases Across the U.S. in 2019 Thus Far

According to this CDC press release from May 30th, the CDC reported 971 cases of measles in the United States thus far in 2019, exceeding 1992's entire year total of 963. If these outbreaks continue through the fall, the U.S. could lose its measles elimination status. Vaccination recommendations differ depending on local activity. ## What can you do now to prepare your practice for measles?

- Make sure you are receiving health alerts (go to <u>www.chifrontline.org</u> to sign up)
- Check CDPH Health Alert Network (HAN) Measles <u>page</u> for updates: contains upto-date measles vaccine recommendations, diagnostic tips, a provider job aid, reporting instructions, as well as local case counts and exposure locations
- Consider reminder/recall activities to ensure all patients are up to date on MMR vaccine
- Encourage early back-to-school visits to prepare families for summer travel


