Looking to increase flu vaccine uptake in your office?

A recent 2019 Pediatrics article showed that providing an educational intervention in the waiting room before a pediatric provider may help increase child influenza vaccine receipt. It found that the parents who received an educational intervention were almost 75% more likely to vaccinate their child by the end of the season and were 59% more likely to have their child vaccinated on the day of the clinic visit.

A simple intervention such as an educational handout can significantly affect the rate of child-hood influenza vaccinations.
