## MAINTAINING ROUTINE PEDIATRIC VACCINATIONS DURING THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC

Although some routine healthcare visits are being postponed or transitioned to telemedicine formats, it is important that infant and childhood vaccinations stay on schedule as often as possible.

Fortunately, the CDC, the American Academy of Family Physicians (AAFP), and the American

Academy of Pediatrics (AAP) have compiled resources and tips to help your practice keep vaccinating patients on time. This is essential to protect Chicago's children from vaccine-preventable diseases.

## Please Note: If a practice can only provide limited well-child visits, healthcare providers are encouraged to prioritize newborn care and vaccination of infants and young children (through 24 months of age) when possible.

Some other tips include:

- Separating visits throughout the day. For example, your clinic could schedule well visits in the morning and sick visits in the afternoon.
- Separating patients by visit type in waiting rooms. Consider reserving a specific area of your clinic for ill patients to create space between ill and well patients.

#### A Note on Adult Immunizations

In the face of community transmission of COVID-19, the CDC recommends that adult immunizations be postponed except in the following cases:

- \*An in-person visit must be scheduled for some other purpose and the clinical preventive service can be delivered during that visit with no additional risk; or
- An individual patient and their clinician believe that there is a compelling need to receive the service based on an assessment that the potential benefit outweighs the risk of exposure to the virus that causes COVID-19."

## **General Instructions**

#### Re-enrollment has 2 parts:

- 1. In I-CARE, complete the Enrollment Form.
- 2. Print the Provider Agreement and have the Medical Director review and sign it. Then return it to the Chicago VFC Program via email (chicagoVFC@cityofchicago.org) or fax (312-746-6220).

The Provider Agreement is the only document that must be <u>printed</u> and <u>sub-</u> <u>mitted by email or fax.</u> All additional information is captured directly in I-CARE.
