2020-21 Seasonal Influenza Vaccine Pre-book

The Chicago VFC Program will supply seasonal influenza vaccine to providers for vaccination of **VFC-eligible children** (Medicaid-eligible, Uninsured, American Indian or Alaskan Native, or <u>underinsured at FQHCs only</u>).

The 2020-21 VFC Pediatric Flu Pre-book is now available at the following link: <u>https://redcap.link/2020fluprebook</u>

Requests must be received by Friday, August 14th, 2020

A few things to remember:

- All formulations are Quadrivalent Influenza Vaccines (QIV).
- Pre-book amount should be requested by *doses* in multiples of 10; if you want 50 doses, please enter *50*, not 5.
- Once available, flu doses will start arriving in your offices. You may not receive your entire order at the same time. We will continue to distribute doses until we have sent your entire pre-book request.
- There is a limited supply of certain influenza vaccine products. If providers request more than what is available, VFC will reach out to your office to redistribute your order with available vaccine.

Providers may choose from the 8 formulations listed below:

- Fluzone 0.25 mL pre-filled syringes, preservative free (6-35 months) QIV*
- Fluzone 0.5 mL single dose vials, preservative free (6 months-18 years) QIV*
- Fluzone 0.5 mL single dose syringes, preservative free (6 months-18 years) -QIV*
- Fluarix 0.5 mL pre-filled syringes, preservative free (6 months-18 years) QIV*
- Flulaval 0.5 mL pre-filled syringes, preservative free (6 months-18 years) QIV*
- Fluzone 0.5 mL multidose vials (6 months-18 years) QIV*
- Flumist 2 mL pre-filled sprayer, preservative free (2-18 years) QIV*
- Flucelvax 0.5 mL single dose syringe, preservative free (4-18 years) QIV*

*QIV contains 4 strains of the influenza virus: two influenza A strains and two influenza B strains

Return Expired Flu Vaccine

You may return flu vaccine from the 2019/20 flu season only **AFTER** it has expired. Please fill out a Vaccine Return Form (available on the HAN) and fax to 312-746-6220.

Please also remember to **remove it from your I-CARE inventory** after submitting the Return Form.
