


#### With Cases on the Rise, Illinois Launches Site to Share Vaccination Data in Long-Term Care Facilities

**SPRINGFIELD** – To help ensure transparency, the Illinois Department of Public Health (IDPH) announced today that COVID-19 vaccination data for both residents and staff in long-term care (LTC) facilities is now available on the IDPH website at <a href="http://www.dph.illinois.gov/covid19/long-term-care-facility-data">http://www.dph.illinois.gov/covid19/long-term-care-facility-data</a>. Given that LTC facilities have experienced a significant portion of COVID-19 deaths, particularly early in pandemic, this resource will be critical for tracking COVID-19 vaccinations for both staff and residents in facilities across state.

#### NHSN VACCINE MODULE – DATA QUALITY REMINDERS

 Check that numbers of partially and fully vaccinated individuals are in their respective boxes

- Avoid delayed reporting
  - CMS looks at a Monday-Sunday reporting week and pulls the data soon after

# **Outbreak Duration for LTCF vs. Local Health Department** for COVID-19

- For LTCF outbreaks
  - Facility needs to follow the LTC guidance for outbreak response, starting with one case.
  - Facility outbreak response has different time frames of 14 days for considering an outbreak response completed
  - If facility goes 14 days with no new cases, then the facility may move out of outbreak response
- For Local Health Departments
  - LHD report into ORS, outbreak duration for COVID-19 outbreak is two incubation periods or 28 days before the LHD considers the outbreak over
  - For ORS, the outbreak stays open until 28 days with no new cases.
- Case Study,
  - A facility has a positive case, and tests every 3-7 days for 14 days with no new cases
  - They have a new case 5 days after completing that first 14-day period
  - The facility has to initiate new outbreak response measures again as per LTC guidance
  - But LHD can keep the same outbreak open in ORS because they didn't go 28 days without a new case
- So even though LTC outbreak response measures may have to be implemented several times, until the facility goes 28 days with no new cases, the LHD would keep the same outbreak open in ORS.

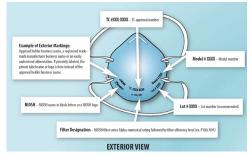

# **Vaccinations and Masking**

- Children under 10 being hospitalize now account for 15% of all persons hospitalized
- Children 10-19 hospitalized for COVID-19 no account for 23% of all persons hospitalized
- Delta variant has been predominate strain
- Community masking is important
- Vaccinations are our strongest and best tool

hospitalized COVID-19 patients are unvaccinated





# **Three Key Steps to Protect Illinois from Variants**

- Masks required indoors for all daycares, and preschool through grade 12 (P-12) students and teachers
- Require vaccinations for State employees working in congregate care settings (State VAs, Correctional Facilities, Department of Human Services Developmental Centers, and State Psychiatric facilities)- Effective October 4, 2021
- Universal Mask mandate required for all residents, staff, and visitors in congregate care/long term care of Congregate care/Long Term Care



## **Residents and Visitors**

- Cloth Face Covering (Launder)
- Procedure Mask (Change frequently, discard if soiled or damaged)

#### FOLLOW THESE GUIDELINES TO PROPERLY WEAR YOUR FACE MASK

Wash your hands before and after Touch only the bands or ties when putting on and taking off your mask.

Make sure the mask fits to cover your nose, mouth and chin. If you adjust the mask to cover those areas, wash your hands before and after.






Make sure you can breathe and talk comfortably through your mask.

Wash reusable masks after each use. If the mask is disposable, discard it when visibly soiled or damaged.

#### **Staff/HCP**

- Procedure/surgical Mask (Discard) if removed, soiled, or damaged)
- Respirator



# **Vaccination and Masking**

Vaccines work

Masks work as both source control and PPE

Ventilation works

Outdoor activities have the lowest risk of transmission

Delta variant of SARS-CoV-2 risk is greater if you are not vaccinated
