BACK TO SCHOOL...IS NOW

It's hard to imagine thinking about the 2023/2024 school year, but the truth is it's not too early to start taking action now. We know that you are aware some children have missed their routine vaccines since the start of the pandemic. Use back to school visits as a time to get your pediatric patients back on track with them. You've heard these techniques before, but it is always a good idea to revisit them and make sure you're using them:

- Target outreach: Use your EHR, patient portal, email, phone calls, reminder/recall letters, or texts.
- Identify patients due for well-child visits by running an I-CARE "Immunization Due" report (instructions at the end of the newsletter).
- Get staff buy-in: Run your clinic's coverage rates in I-CARE and re-establish team huddles at the beginning of the day to remind clinic staff of the importance of getting children back on track.
- Share information: Promote the importance of routine immunizations on your website and social media.
- Make it convenient: Offer nurse-only quick shot visits. Consider hosting drivethru or pop-up vaccine clinics on site. Consider weekend vaccine clinics to help busy families.
- Share safety net options: Educate patients who lost insurance about Medicaid and VFC and help patients ensure they complete the steps needed for the redetermination process.

WATER SAFETY REMINDER

Vaccines keep children safe and growing - and there are a lot of other things we need to do to keep them healthy. During warmer months, this includes water safety. Remind your patients about the importance of water safety - like never leaving a child alone while they are in or near water, making sure pool gates are closed and child-proof, remembering that "floaties" are not a substitute for a life jacket, and to make sure a life-jacket is worn on boats at all times. COVID-19 VACCINE PROTECTION WANES

A <u>meta-analysis</u> of COVID-19 vaccine studies suggests that vaccine effectiveness against an Omicron COVID-19 infection quickly declines within a year of vaccination. The review showed that vaccine effectiveness against Omicron infection and symptomatic disease was under 20% six months after vaccination with the primary series and under 30% nine months after vaccination with a booster dose. This demonstrates a need for additional doses (primarily among older and immunocompromised populations), as well as a need for updated formulations of the vaccine. Despite waning protection, everyone 6 months and older should be vaccinated in an effort to keep themselves and their loved ones healthy for as long as possible.

COVID-19 VACCINE CPT CODES

With the recent change to the use of bivalent-only COVID-19 vaccine products, there have been some updates to the coding structure for COVID-19 vaccine administration and counseling. JANSSEN COVID-19 VACCINE NO LONGER AVAILABLE

The Janssen (J&J) COVID-19 vaccine is <u>no longer available in the US</u>, as all remaining doses expired as of May 7, 2023. Any remaining stock should be disposed of in accordance with local, state, and federal regulations. All guidance for use of the Janssen COVID-19 vaccine has also been removed from the CDC website. Those who previously received 1 or 2 doses of Janssen COVID-19 vaccine should receive at least one bivalent dose of a Pfizer or Moderna COVID-19 vaccine.

Remember: COVID-19 vaccines are on the ACIP recommended vaccine schedule. All VFC providers will be required to offer COVID-19 vaccines upon commercialization (expected this fall).



POLIO VACCINE

<u>Significant progress</u> has been made toward the eradication of polio, with a 99.9% global decrease in wild poliovirus (WPV) cases since 1988. Afghanistan and Pakistan are the only two countries that still see transmission of WPV type 1, which leaves the door open to transmission in other countries with un- or undervaccinated populations. Similarly, transmission of vaccine-derived poliovirus (from the circulation of oral poliovirus vaccine strains) can occur among insufficiently vaccinated populations and was identified in the US in 2022. These trends exemplify the value of polio vaccines and the need for renewed vaccination efforts. FLU PRE-BOOK

Although summer is just getting started, it's also time to start thinking about the fall respiratory virus season and flu vaccines. The preordering survey for the 2023-2024 flu vaccine supply will be available soon! In the meantime, please consider your patient numbers from the 2022-2023 season for a more accurate estimate of how much to order.

RSV VACCINE

An RSV vaccine for pregnant women has <u>received initial approval</u> from the FDA's Vaccines and Related Biological Products Advisory Committee (VRBPAC). It is expected that the FDA will determine whether to approve the vaccine over the summer.


- Two staff members from each VFC site must complete training.


Instruction for Running Immunization Due Report

Step 1: Log into I-CARE.

Step 2: Click on "Reports" at the top of your screen.



Step 3: Under "Vaccine Management Reports" click "Immunizations Due"



VFC Fligibility Status Chart - A Chart to help determine who to vaccinate with VFC Vaccine.


Step 4: Input criteria

- Carefully input "Birth Date From:"/ "Birth Date To:" and "Shot Date From:"/ "Shot Date To:"
 ensuring the criteria meets VFC eligibility (patients ages 18 and under)
- Select appropriate "Groups:" to generate report for specific vaccines or "All" to generate report for all due vaccines




Step 4: Next to "Report Notification" click "Email" Click "Submit Background Report" to generate report


• Immunization Due Report does not generate instantaneously, therefore you must select a notification method to receive an update from I-CARE when the report is complete.




• Immunization Due Report Running
